






#### 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The University has got academic recognition under section 2(f) from the University Grants Commission (UGC) on 28th March, 1985 and started functioning from 1st April, 1985. It has got financial recognition under Section 12-B of the UGC on 25th March, 1994. The University was converted in to a Central University by an Act of Parliament of India, The Rajiv Gandhi University Act, 2006 No.8 of 2007 w.e.f. 09/04/2007.

The university has expanded both vertically and horizontally by starting new departments and augmenting facilities to cater to the needs of the native communities of the state, the marginalized and the disempowered, while not losing sight of the national goals and priorities. The university can take pride in its alumni in the state and central government services and in various institutions, industries and organizations across the country.

#### 2.0 INFORMATION ABOUT ADMISSION

RGU's mission is to provide opportunities and support students from diverse background and assist them to become well-informed global citizens by developing their intellectual, moral, civic and creative capacities to the fullest through multi-faceted education and sustained engagement with local, national and global communities. The University also aims to carry out academic process for achieving excellence through active and dynamic student-teacher participation and inculcate high moral, ethical and professional standards among students which will enable them to develop knowledge and skills necessary to achieve their professional goals so as to improve the performance and also provide leadership and service to the community.

University has implemented NHEQF and NCrF based curriculum framework in all its academic programmes as per NEP-2020. Rajiv Gandhi University admission processes is covered through (i) external test-based system viz. CUET-UG marks for under graduate programmes with 10+2 eligibility, CUET-PG marks Post Graduate and Diploma programmes, UGC/CSIR-NET marks for PhD programmes, NCTE-marks for ITEP programmes and (ii) RGUCET based marks for 80 percent of seats available for PG level programmes offered. Irrespective to the mode of entry/admission to the university academic programmes are based on merit and existing guidelines.

As the admission to RGU transcends political and institutional boundaries, the students while admitting themselves should submit their original 'College Leaving Certificate/Migration Certificate" to the departments/institutes concerned compulsorily or within a specified period.





#### 2.2 PG PROGRAMMES

Admissions to PG programmes will be carried out through CUET-PG 2025 and RGUCET-2025. Twenty percent seats are earmarked for applicants applying through CUET-PG 2025 and eighty percent seats are to be filled through RGUCET 2025. The candidates desirous to get admitted either through CUET-PG 2025 or RGUCET 2025 have to apply separately. EWS seats will be proportionally divided between CUET-PG 2025 and RGUCET 2025 based candidates (20:80 proportion). Sports quota, supernumerary quota, single girl child quota (1 for each type) will be admissible through RGUCET 2025 only. If there is no such candidate among RGUCET-2025 applicants the seats will be offered to CUET-PG 2025 based applicants.

Admission process will commence, for 20 percent of seats for each programme, soon after declaration of results of CUET-PG 2025 as well as RGUCET 2025. Application portal, for RGU with a time line, will be active for all the offered programmes. Merit list and wait listed candidates' list will be notified by respective Departments. Skill test / Group discussion / physical test, wherever required will be conducted by respective Departments. The candidates can apply through https://admissions.rgu.ac.in/

Admission through RGUCET 2025 will commence with applications process and entrance test. Dates for Entrance Test will be notified separately. The candidates can apply through https://admissions.rgu.ac.in/. Skill test / physical test, wherever required will be conducted by respective Departments.

Graduates under 10+2+3 pattern of education from Rajiv Gandhi University or any other UGC recognized University with **45% marks in Honours/Major or 50% marks in Pass Course** in the subjects/Elective subjects concerned are eligible for admission. Details of eligibility and minimum marks required for each programme are mentioned against each programme offered.

Candidates who have appeared in their UG final semester examinations and awaiting results are also allowed to apply and appear in the entrance test. They are to produce their pass certificates and marksheets during the time of admission. SC, ST and OBC (NCL) candidates get relaxation up to 5% marks in the Pass and Honours courses. NCL candidate should produce NCL certificate issued for the current year.

For admission in M.A. Hindi, Uttama (Sahitya Ratna) is considered equivalent to B.A. (Hons.) in Hindi, whereas Visharad (from Hindi Sahitya Sammelan, Allahabad)/ Praveen/ Ratna are considered equivalent to B.A. (Pass) in Hindi.

Entrance marks and additional weightage, if any, shall be the criteria for admission. However, merit shall remain the criteria for courses where entrance is not conducted.

EWS seats will be proportionally divided between CUET-PG 2025 and RGUCET 2025 based candidates (20:80 proportion).

#### **B.Ed. ADMISSION**

Admissions will be carried out through CUET-PG 2025 and RGUCET-2025.

Out of the 100 seats, a few seats are reserved for deputed teachers nominated by the Department of Education, Govt. of Arunachal Pradesh, and one seat each for Sports Quota and Wards of RGU Employees (Supernumerary). Remaining seats and additional 10 seats for EWS are equally divided between Direct seats and Paid seats to be filled as per merit and reservation for various categories. The admission to the Paid seats in B. Ed. will be given on the basis of merit in entrance test and additional weightage if any, on payment of additional fees over and above the prescribed B.Ed fee. Same reservation rule of the University shall be followed for paid seats also. However, the discipline wise quota for both Direct and Paid seats shall be fixed for admission by the University.

B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com./ BFA/ B.MUS./ BCA/ B.Sc. in Agriculture/Horticulture under 10+2+3 scheme from Rajiv Gandhi University or any other recognized University with 50% or above marks in graduation are eligible for admission to B. Ed. Two Year Programme. CUET-PG and RGUCET based seats categorized into science and arts stream. Please visit admissions.rgu.ac.in for subject codes for entrance exam.

Candidates should have 55% or above marks in Post Graduate Degree (M.A./M.Sc./M.Com./MCA/M.Sc. in Agriculture/Horticulture OR B.E./B.Tech. with specialization in Mathematics with a minimum of 55% marks).

The state Govt. sponsored (deputed) teachers having 10+2+2 pattern can be admitted in B.Ed programme. SC, ST and OBC (NCL) candidates shall be given a relaxation of 5% marks. The OBC (NCL) candidates should produce Non-Creamy Layer (NCL) certificate issued for the current calendar year. Selected candidates for Direct and Paid seats have to submit an undertaking that they are not in service. ### (B) PHYSICAL FITNESS TEST

- i) **Physical Fitness**: Marks will be awarded in Physical Fitness on the basis of performance in 50 meters sprint, standing broad jump, Medicine Ball (over head back throw) and 1000 meters run/walk. The performance shall be converted into points as per norms developed by the Department.
- ii) **Proficiency in Games & Sports**: Marks will be awarded by a committee on the basis of skills performed and performance in one game/sport, as opted by the candidate. Testing shall be done in following games/sports: Archery, Badminton, Boxing, Cricket, Football, Handball, Judo, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Lawn Tennis, Table Tennis, Track & Field, Volleyball, Weight-Lifting, Power Lifting, Yoga.

### (C) AWARD OF BONUS MARKS (SPORTS PARTICIPATION)

All those candidates who have represented India in any International Championship OR who have won positions during last three academic sessions (i.e. July 2022 to April 2015) in the Junior / Senior National Championships, being organized by respective National Federation / All India or Inter-Zonal Inter-University Tournament or SGFI National meets, will receive Bonus Marks as per the criteria given below:

#### 3 RESERVATION AND WEIGHTAGE

Reservation will be implemented as per the Govt. policies/ UGC norms and guidelines/practices in the University.

Admission to all undergraduate (UG) programmes with 10+2 eligibility, offered in RGU shall be through CUET-UG 2025 (100%). Admission to all PG programmes and UG programmes with Bachelor's degree as eligibility, shall be through CUET-PG 2025 (20% of seats) and RGUCET 2025 (80% of seats).

Bonafide students from affiliated colleges of Rajiv Gandhi University belonging to all categories shall be given an **additional weightage of 10% on the marks scored in CUET/RGUCET** over and above their RGUCET/CUET score, whichever is applicable, for preparing the merit list for admission in various Post Graduate and Under-graduate courses including B.Ed & B.PEd. (for example: i. CUET PG mark is 45%, 4.5 will be added; total will be 49.5%; ii. RGUCET mark is 55.5%, 5.55 will be added; total will be 61.05%).

Likewise, the APST (Arunachal Pradesh Scheduled Tribe) applicants passing out from other UGC recognized universities shall be given an **additional weightage of 5% on the marks scored** over and above their RGUCET/CUET score, whichever is applicable. (for example: i. CUET PG mark is 42%, 2.1 will be added; total will be 44.1%; ii. RGUCET mark is 48.5%, 2.425 will be added; total will be 50.925%).

One additional seat in each course/programme (except B.P.Ed., PhD) will be kept for applicants under Sports Quota. The outstanding Sports Men/Sports Women will be given 10% weightage for representing the country at the international level, 5% for representing the state at the national level and 3% for inter-University at national level in RGU recognized sports and shall be added over & above the percentage of marks obtained at qualifying examinations for preparing merit list for admission. The Sports Certificate, shall not be prior to 21<sup>st</sup> July 2022 (3 years till academic year 2025-26 of RGU). However, the candidates applying under the sports quota will have to satisfy the minimum percentage of marks prescribed to be eligible for admission before adding the weightage. If no suitable candidate is found eligible for the sports quota, the seat will be declared null and void. The participation certificate under Sports quota will only be considered for the same, subject to issuance of the certificate from the Directorate of School Education or the authorized office of JNV & KVS of the particular region in case of SGFI Tournaments, University authority in case of AIU organized tournaments and from State Sports Federations in case of state, National and International level tournaments.

Likewise, one **additional seat** in each course/programme (except for PhD) will be reserved on **supernumerary basis** for the child/spouse of the regular employees of Rajiv Gandhi University, if found otherwise eligible. However, first preference will be given to the child of the university employee. Provision of concession is also kept for wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Leprosy affected people. Provision for 10% seats in various courses/programmes for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) has been made over and above the intake capacity. Candidates seeking admission under EWS category should refer to Govt. of India rules and submit the requisite documents. In case, EWS seats remain vacant then, the seats will be treated as null & void and shall not be filled-up by candidates of any other categories.

One additional seat is reserved for single Girl child for each course/programme (except for PhD). Notarized affidavit with relevant documents issued / Certificates by Sub Divisional Magistrate / First Class Magistrate / Tehsildar of the territorial jurisdiction.

For NSS Volunteer a weightage of 0.6 Percentage Points over CUET / RGUCET Score will be added for 240 hours of Social Service/NSS NIC (National Integration Camp/RDC (Republic Day Camp) and weightage of 0.3 Percentage Points over CUET/RGUCET Score will be added for 120 hours of Social Service/ 1 Special Camp. For NCC Cadet, a weightage of 0.6 and 0.3 Percentage Points over CUET/RGUCET Score will be added for 'C' and 'B' Certificate holders, respectively. (Only one Certificate shall be considered whichever is highest).

N.B: In case of any tie, the percentage of the qualifying exam will be taken into consideration. In the event of tie in the qualifying exam, the date of birth shall be considered.

Further, following the directives of Ministry of Education, Govt. of India; provision of concession for the wards of Kashmiri migrants for admission in this University shall be extended, as under:

- i. Relaxation in cut off percentage upto 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- ii. Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course-wise.
- iii. Reservation of at least one seat in merit quota in technical/professional courses in the University.
- iv. Waiving of domicile requirements.

## 6.0 ADMISSION TO HALLS OF RESIDENCE (HOSTELS)

Admission to hostel is limited and it is based on the merit. Admission to hostel is subject to admission to a programme and University rules and guidelines. Hostel accommodations are of two types: Regular and HEFA hostels, with different monthly fee. The students, if intended to avail hostel accommodation will have to apply online during admission to a programme of the University. The applicant can opt for any one type or both types of hostels. The Head of the Department / Director of the Institute will allot the hostel seat on the basis of application received and rules and regulations related to hostel admission.

On basis of notification by the Head/ Director of the Department /Institute, the selected candidate will pay the Boarding Fee and Caution money in the account provided in the Notification.

The **caution money** will be refunded only after completion of the course or when a student fails or leaves the course. No partial withdrawal will be permitted in any case before the completion of the course within the current academic session.

#### 7.0 FACILITIES

The Central Library, Rajiv Gandhi University is committed to providing uninterrupted access to knowledge and research resources for students. The library maintains an extensive collection of books, journals, e-resources, and digital databases to support academic excellence and research. It ensures 24x7 access to online resources, research assistance, and plagiarism detection through Turnitin (iThenticate). The library offers well-equipped reading spaces, internet access, and user-friendly services, including book lending, reference support, and digital archives. Adhering to its motto, "User Satisfaction in terms of Information Need" and "Service with a Smile", the library aims to create an inclusive and resourceful learning environment. Students are encouraged to utilize these facilities to enhance their academic and research pursuits.





The **Health Centre** of Rajiv Gandhi University is located at the centre point of the campus. It is a Primary Health Centre and caters to the health care requirements of the staffs, staff dependents, students and the visitors to the campus. The Centre welcomes people from the neighboring villages of the University who seek consultations and treatment. The services provided are free for every patient who visits the Health Centre. The Health Centre is manned by two Medical Officers, one Staff Nurse, one Medical Laboratory Technician, two Multi-Tasking Staffs and one Gardener. It is a four bedded which includes three beds in the Observation Room and one bed in the Dressing Room.
