Submission Guidelines

Prospective authors are requested to adhere to the following guidelines to maintain consistency and quality:

1. Abstract

- · Word limit: 200-250 words
- · Must include: objectives, research problem, methodology, and key findings
- Include 4–5 keywords at the end

2. Paper Format

- Word limit: 2500–3000 words (excluding references and appendices)
- File format: Microsoft Word (.doc/.docx)
- Font & Size:
 - o Title: Bold, Times New Roman, Size 15
 - o Sub-headings: Bold, Times New Roman, Size 14
 - o Sub-sub-headings: Bold, Times New Roman, Size 13
 - o Body Text: Times New Roman, Size 12, Single line spacing
 - o For Hindi/Devanagari script: Mangal 14 or Kokila 18 (Unicode)









3. Page Setup

- Margins: Left 1.5", Right 1", Top 1", Bottom 1"
- · Pages must be numbered at the bottom right.

4. Author Details

 Immediately below the title: include Author's Name, Designation, Institutional Affiliation, Full Address, Email ID, and Contact Number

5. References

- Must follow APA 7th Edition citation style
- · Non-compliant papers may be returned for revision
- Endnotes (if needed) should appear after the references
- · Footnotes are not permitted

6. Additional Guidelines

- Appendices, if any, should follow the main text and come before the references
- Equations (if any) must be on separate lines, left-aligned, and numbered consecutively
- Tables should be created using MS Word table format, with Font Size 11

7. Submission Email

- Send the abstract and full paper as separate Microsoft Word (.doc/.docx) files

- The corresponding author will receive confirmation upon receipt and acceptance status ovf the abstract/paper.

How to reach Rajiv Gandhi University?

By Road

- · From Guwahati to Itanagar
- Regular State Government Bus (APSTS Volvo)
- Regular buses operated by Private Travel Agencies (AIRBUS, NETWORK etc.)

By Rail:

Nearest Railway Station is located at Gumto which is just 10 minutes' drive and Naharlagun & Harmuti which are 30 minutes away from RGU

By Air:

Donyi-Polo Airport, Hollongi, Itanagar is the nearest airport. Hollongi is around 51 km from Doimukh, which can be covered at an approximate time of 1 hour 30 minutes. From Hollongi, one has to travel by road to RGU.

Note:

Since Arunachal Pradesh is a protected area under the Bengal Eastern Frontier Regulation, 1873, participants from outside the state are requested to obtain a valid Inner Line Permit (ILP). It can be procured online or offline and must be produced at check gates when requested by the authorities.
